CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2021

The Covid19 Crisis has seriously disrupted the Club's Summer and Winter seasonal competitions and reduced participation by our members. It is possible the impact will be felt for several years.

Winter Section

President Dan Ward Burton's plans came to an abrupt halt when the 2020 Winter Season was cancelled after a few games as the Victoria went into a state wide COVID lockdown.

Summer Section

The Summer Club with Russell Ferguson in his second year as President, managed to play a reduced schedule of 13 games under the strict Covid restrictions that applied. The Club performed very well under the circumstances.

The Firsts finished fifth and just missed a place in the finals. The Seconds finished the home and away games on top of the ladder but were knocked out in the play offs. The Thirds and Fourths were competitive but lacked pitching and finished in the bottom half of their competitions.

International players were not allowed to participate this season and Matt Gourlay stepped up to take on the role of Club Coach and Manager of the Firsts and did an outstanding job under demanding circumstances. He was ably assisted by Bryan Kloppe when he arrived part way through the season.

Our Women's team led by Manager Michelle Ogilvie played an 8 game season successfully introducing a number of younger players.

The Masters also played an 8 game season with a 50%WP





The Summer Juniors are in a rebuilding phase after decades of success and this area of the Club needs more focus moving forward. Joey Tucker efforts as the Junior Coordinator and junior team manager were exceptional. U16 Metro team performed very well under Manager Stell Michell's and the team was undefeated at the conclusion of the home and away rounds.

Little league and Tee ball participation improved over the previous season and this will remain a high area of focus as the Club continues a rebuilding phase.

The Club successfully hosted the State Little League finals in March 2021 in spite of the adverse weather conditions. A big thank you to all who assisted over that weekend

Batting Tunnel

Lighting: Work to install new Tunnel lighting was undertaken by Jarrod and Laurie Hall during July 2020 at a cost of \$1,300 for the materials. The Club is very appreciative of the labour and expertise donated by the Hall Family.

Main Field Canopy

In November 2020 the poles supporting the canopy developed fatigue cracks and were removed by KCC for safety reasons. The replacement canopy incorporates a much improved design that extends to the end of the dugouts and is expected to be installed by July 2021. KCC have assumed the responsibility for the ongoing maintenance.

Administration

Fortunately, the Club was in a sound financial position prior to the advent of Covid-19 Virus thanks largely to the close management of our finances by the Summer/Winter Executives and the tireless work and oversight by our Treasurer Judy Williams.

The Club successfully applied for several grants totalling over \$10k to assist the Clubs meet unavoidable running costs and to support our efforts to retain and attract new players.

The relationship with the Mordialloc Ducks and continues to strengthen and a draft Enduring Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is under negotiation to formalise the relationship.





Progress on the KCC Needs Analysis of the Baseball and Hockey Clubs current and future requirements at the Kingston Heath Reserve has been held over due to COVID -19 and changes in KCC Councillors involved following the last elections.

Infrastructure Priorities:

- Full Lighting of our Main Field, artificial turf on the infield, extended fencing on Senior Field No 2 as well as, Dugouts and a Scorers box on Senior Field No3.
- Pavilion needs for both Clubs include, additional change rooms for Females and Umpires, extra storage, canteen extensions and dedicated committee rooms.

Plans in these areas have been delayed by Covid-19 and will need to be refreshed.

Vale Bill Anderson Life Member 1957



For two decades through to 1966, Bill played for in our A Grade team in the old Prahran Club including 7 seasons as the Club Coach and Playing Manager from 1960 to 1966. A brilliant third baseman, Bill represented Victoria at the Claxton Shield during the 1950's and was a member of Prahran's first "Major League" A Grade Premiership team in 1949 defeating Collingwood at the old Olympic Park.

Vale Jane Olsen


