A2 - V.B.A.

In the early part of the season this team, although playing reasonably good baseball was unable to win many games and after 13 games were in eighth position. However, they continued to improve and by winning the last five games finished only one point out of the finals with 10 wins and 1 draw. I feel that the Club will benefit in future by the experience gained by the younger members of this team and I am confident of and place in the finals as next season.

B Grade - D.B.A.

The leadership of this team also changed during the year Fred Capper started the season as Captain and when he was promoted Graeme Ainscough took over. This team, our Club's \$Th nine meets the firsts of several teams in this grade and I fell it is a great credit to the players and to Graeme to finish the home and away games in second position. They were unfortunate to lose a close semi-final 2 runs to 1 and had to face Lyndale, the eventual premiers in the Preliminary Final. In appalling in conditions, they took the lead in the game but failed to capitalise on several key opportunities.



The summary of this team capably led by Harry Kalinski is somewhat similar to that of the A2 team and was similarly unfortunate after a good finish to the season to finish only one point out of the finals. The team took a while to settle down and had some selection problems during the year which included the ss of a regular pitcher. However, their performances were quite credible for, as or Club's 5Th nine faced the 3Rd nine of other clubs in the competition and we look for a place in the finals next year.

C Grade - D.B.A.

History has habit of repeating itself for this team and 1973 under the leadership of Mick Walton was no exception. Again finishing the season with a double chance, we all thought that this year would be a premiership. It was not to be however and we were soundly beaten in both the semi- final and the preliminary final. This team provided a spot for many of our "veterans" to continue in baseball and I am sure that a good year's sport was enjoyed by those who still wish to play and support the Club.

JUNIOR REPORTS

The Club fielded 5 junior teams and our greatest problems experienced was to find coaches and managers for these teams. Two U13 teams played in the V.B.A. competitions – one at Sandringham and one at Fawkner park. The team at Fawkner Park played good consistent baseball throughout the season and finished in the finals. However, occasion or the opposition proved to be a bit much for the youngsters and they were soundly defeated in their Semi=final.

The team at Sandringham did not enjoy the success of the Fawkner Park boys and it took some time before they scored their first win. However. success did not come very often and it was a credit to the boys and their coach that they continued to try hard each week and I trust that they will experience better success next year.

A Third U13 team was entered in the D.B.A. and for most of the year was in the top four but a late season slump proved fatal and they needed to win the last game to reach the finals. The game was lost however the team had to be content with fifth place.

Each of these teams contains some excellent young players and I feel sure that with so many boys of this age in and around the Club our future is bright, provided we are able to find enough competent coaches to teach these lads the fundamentals of good baseball.

An U15 team played in the D.B.A. and we suffered from an acute shortage of players in this age group throughout the season. So you can see that although playing many games with only seven players the effort of reaching the finals was surely first class. They won the Semi-final against Noble Park with only 8 players and faced Frankston again with only 8 players



with anU13 substitute in the Preliminary Final and they were unfortunate to lose 2 runs to one. I must congratulate the boys on their efforts and trust that we will be able to find another 4-5 boys of this age next year.

The U17 team playing in the D.B.A. – presented the Club with its second premiership for the year and it was probably the most unusual performance of all time. The preliminary was called against them 4-2 but a protest was upheld and the final 30 minutes of the game were replayed . This was enough time for the them to level the score at 4 all. The game was relayed the following Saturday and won by Chelt/Ptrahran 10-6. The boys performed really well in the Grad Final in which the lead changed with almost each frame. However they fought the game out well to eventually win a great game.
