Sam has been kind enough to do an interview for our website to give us insight in to what it takes to play college baseball and what he has experienced so far.

Matt: What is the name of the college you signed with?

<u>Sam:</u> The College I signed with is called Lower Columbia College.

Matt: How did you end up committing to that school?

<u>Sam:</u> Throughout the summer ball season, we played many showcase tournaments where we were exposed to colligate coaches. Primarily from the west coast but also from all over the US. Matt: How many games will the college season be?

Matt: Where do they have you living?

<u>Sam:</u> I will be living in an apartment complex suggested by the school.

Matt: Are there any other Aussies that will be playing with you?

<u>Sam:</u> I will be attending LC with Chase Hodkinson from Waverley Baseball Club. It's very exciting to be able to share the experience with someone from home.

Matt: Do they love the Aussie accent?

<u>Sam</u>: Ha ha! The majority of people over here love the accent.

But I have had a lot of people tell me that they have no clue what I am saying a lot of the time.

<u>Matt:</u> What advice would you give to the junior Rustlers that have ambitions to play baseball at a US college?

<u>Sam:</u> My advice to anyone wanting to play college baseball is to start collecting contacts of coaches both here and overseas. The networking that coaches are able to do over here is amazing. Start filming and exposing yourself to coaches over here. There is a place for everyone to play over here. But at what level is up to the player, depending on the player's dedication to the game.

Matt: When will you be popping back down for a visit?

<u>Sam:</u> I will be back home for a couple of weeks from the 10th of August onwards.

I will be heading to Seattle late August for Fall Ball.
