Friday Night and Sunday Ball Report - Summer 2002-2003

Our Friday night "Centre" program was this year changed to the VBA South East Centre. I'm not usually given to portraying the negative side of things but with the new "travel" policy being applied to the Domestic baseball I feel a need to voice my concern. The VBA has now, for quite a while been unable to instigate growth in the base numbers of baseball. It has left promotion to the clubs or relied upon other influences such as the trickle down effect of elite baseball programs. Cheltenham has always done its own work in promotion and the seeking of players. This occurs at the junior level and our efforts are focused heavily in this area...we do a better than good job at promoting baseball as a sport for our local community. They (VBA) do not. Instead of running "Elite" programs in parallel to Domestic programs they run to the detriment of domestic junior club ball. Far too much resource afforded to this area for far too little result.

The VBA now intervenes in the managing and running of what was once the Cheltenham Domestic Baseball Centre which has consistently been one of the few highly successful junior centres in the metro area. The jury shall remain out on what effect and influence the VBA way of management will have on our club programs. If communication is a measure then we're going to have some hurdles to jump! This is due to an almost total inability or lack of desire to debate, consult, and continually communicate with clubs. Issues such as driving past neighbouring clubs on the way to play Berwick where the rooms aren't open (no WC's) and gloves are used as bases so the kids can at least play. Unknown season start dates. Start dates that ensure early season involvement for new and existing players (cricket starts prior to Baseball), rules and distribution of same, structure of games, codes of conduct and simple reporting practices where duty of care are prominent, (this is development baseball for goodness sake), umpiring issues, scoring clinics, and umpires clinics. These issues now become the role of the VBA's to sort and provide. ... I probably should thank them for taking the load...but will it work? This situation did not occur when the centre was overseen by us. We built it and now the VBA feels it will take it over and develop it further...my concern remains that they do these things with little or no consultation and to the detriment of clubs with good programs and processes; the jury is definitely out on VBA and its worth to many levels of baseball.

Cheltenham does a remarkably good job at providing a sporting environment where our children are appreciated as individuals and club members and where our guest teams are accorded the same privileges. A lot of effort from some very committed people provides the backbone of our club. This is why we do well; we have better people where communication and support are paramount.

To the VBA I say...stop taking fees for nought and start to assist (meaningfully, knowingly and caringly) in providing ongoing support for those who are doing exactly that. (Perhaps I should send the VBA the CD..."where do the children play"... to replace the "My Way" and "we want it all" theme songs they clearly must have in their offices. Does the word "partnerships" mean anything to this association?)

Having exorcised that little demon of a thought (this is a reporting letter) we now move along with the seasons team reports. Thank you for your patience in reading this part of the report, I hope it is informative and gives perspective to those who may follow - history is important and I would remind people that ill does prosper when good people do nothing.



The Friday night competition was contested by five Cheltenham Under 12 and four Cheltenham Under 14 teams and once again we congratulate the players on the manner in which they played throughout the season. Terrific displays of sportsmanship and a keenness to be their best both on and off the diamond. New coaches and new teams performed extremely well and this was evidenced by team ladder positions at the completion of the season. Cowboys, Broncos, Stallions, Mavericks and Indians all performing well. To all our coaching staff and team supporters I say thank you for your involvement and the opportunities you have provided the players, team and club. The Grand Final for Under 12's saw the "Indians" team trying very hard but were unable to be premiers - runners up was still a marvellous effort and one that many other teams would gladly have taken if offered.

The Under 14 Friday night saw our teams extremely competitive with three of the four teams being in the finals. Eventually the Stallions played the Mavericks in what was a very tight and well contested Grand Final with the Stallions taking out the flag. Great game and to all the Friday night teams a great season. Hope to see all of you folks for the next season.

As our club people may be aware, we have a club policy that requires all Sunday game 12's and 14's players to compulsorily play Friday night to be eligible for the Sunday VBA competition. This policy is there so as to enhance and upskill not only these players but those Friday night players who choose this night as their main sport event. Accordingly we divide the "more skilled" players amongst these teams to increase skills and to improve competition. This policy does work and our Friday night and Sunday programs have remained quite vigorous for many years. Let's continue this policy.

Sunday ball is the VBA State and Metro leagues time on the diamonds. This is what "we" refer to as the baseball extension program. No doubt it is the more skilled and competitive fixture for junior baseball and many junior players strive to play here.

We have nine Sunday teams from 12's to 18's. All have performed remarkably well this season in fact I think the level to which they achieved was just wonderful. Many of these teams commenced the season with only the basic level of skill and application and excelled enough to achieve finals appearances for all but three of the teams with these three finishing outside the four on percentage... a terrific individual and club effort. Being the demanding little beast I am, I believe we can achieve to this level and beyond next season it will take more thought and application for not only our players but the overall off-field network to achieve higher and ongoing consistent results...we can be part of this program.

The results of each team are contained within our team coach reports.

To thank people who have assisted during the season is both necessary and essential. Constantly our workers state that they are not seeking thanks, however I believe the work and achievements of these people requires recognition. The obvious danger here is that I will forget a name...so I will applogise now if that is the case and trust that you accept this as an apology.


