Needless to say this was

always going to be a challenge for any coach, but particularly for a rookie. And so, we got off to the sort of start one would expect, failing to score in the first two games. Finally we met Ormond, and with both sides only scraping 6 players each, both teams hit the diamond with no outfield. Our luck changed and we scraped in our first (and only) win for the season. We met Ormond later in the season and we went down fairly convincingly. The Tigers were saved from extinction early into the season with just 7 players, and we finally secured a full complement of 10 players. The Tigers are lucky enough to have 3 girls on our team, Niamh, Ruby and my daughter Hannah (one of the first timers), and each one of them has shone this season at various times.

Has a good knowledge of the game and will go a long way providing he keeps in mind that first and foremost it needs to be FUN, and hopefully he will keep listening to advice from coaches and other players, including big brother Jack.

Niamh is a gem! A consistent hitter, leading off nearly every game - she is confident and a quiet achiever. A real pleasure to coach as she always listens and then does what's asked, and happily played every position this season. (perhaps not so happy behind the catcher's gear...) Should be really proud of her season and I think has a really bright future in any sport – a natural athlete, but with the smarts as well!

Hannah came in as a first timer and amazingly was quick to establish herself as one of the most consistent batters, giving the coach confidence to put her in at second. Hannah's also improved enormously in the field, having played nearly all positions, and no longer stands under a fly yelling "I can't do it, I can't do it!" but not getting out of the way... A great leader on the field, and has had an amazing first season.

Matt Coe is the quietest of the bunch, and simply gets the job done, whether as a relief pitcher, catcher, any base or outfield. You can rely on Matt to concentrate and stay focused for the whole game. A very handy pitcher, and I would have ideally liked to have used him more in this role, but still did really well this season, always focused and involved in the field and getting on base, and beyond, when at bat.

Rod Warner is another one of our first timers and must be the most polite kid I've met. A real credit to his folks. Despite lacking previous experience, Rod started off well and despite a very stiff stance on the plate, has had a good share of hits. Rod also had his first go at pitching a few weeks back with reasonable success, and has a new found respect for the catching position, particularly in the heat. Played every position and never grumbled about where he is placed. Not the fastest runner between bases, but gets on due to his solid batting.

Luke came into the side late — I recall this small kid standing quietly on his own on the sidelines during training. When asked which team he was in he replied "this one" — What's it called. - "The Tigers" he replied.... Oky Doky, you're in! I very quickly understood that this one is a natural athlete with the bat, ball and glove. Can play any position, and runs like the clappers. Being young, can have a tendency to push the boundaries - Can I pitch Can I pitch Can I pitch (Just remember the Coach / player hierarchy...) Always the first to start cleaning up the diamond after practice - no questions! Huge future for Luke, but this could be in any sport.

Lachlan tends to put too much pressure on himself to perform and not let the side down. Not the best season with the bat for Lachlan, but he has found a new skill in the catcher's position. Lachlan has excelled in this difficult role, and this has helped his knowledge of the game. Always encouraging his pitcher, quick off his feet to chase a wild pitch and always has his head in the game.

James is our final first timer and is another one who will typically listen and then do. A real thinker and asks lots of good questions, and always puts a great effort in. Played well on base and also in the outfield. Had a terrific go at pitching recently with good results. Remembers to the little things such as backing up his team mates if a ball goes past, applauding good play, and always comes with a great attitude. A great sense of humour, and a really endearing and positive nature.

Ethan came into the Tigers the same week as Luke and we finally had 10 players. A very shy kid, Ethan still plays Tball, but wanted to give Baseball a go with his mate Lachlan. Should be proud of a great first season. Did not have the chance to play all positions but developed into a reliable outfielder, involved in several plays getting the ball from the outfield to base for the out. Has grown in confidence with the bat and although has not yet made it all the way home, he's been on base and has also has shown real potential as a big hitter with his broad shoulders. Just needs to relax with the bat, loosen up and let it swing.

As very much a rookie coach with minimal experience in the game, I've really enjoyed having extremely supportive parents. I was ably assisted by Ruby's dad, Steve, Niamh's mum Jane as Bench Manager, who typically filled in with coach's pitch due to my appalling record of striking out my own team. Tom's mum, Michelle, not only took care of the Team Manager role sending out all the emails etc, but also took care of the scoresheet nearly every game (Having done this for a few seasons myself, I know this is a thankless task, and really detracts from a parent's ability to sit back and enjoy watching their kids play, so I am eternally grateful to Michelle for this.) Matt's mum Cathy helped with scoring on the occasions Michelle was not around, so thanks there also.I also must thank Jack, Tom's brother, for his assistance throughout the season, whether the occasional coach's pitch, offering advice to me, always encouraging and pushing Tom to make the best of things, helping out the team at training, and so on.

I've really enjoyed having all the other parents participating and offering assistance and encouragement. It's very humbling as a coach to have such great support. I also need to acknowledge the support of a few other comrades in Craig Sexton and Paul Cummings who are always willing to offer advice and try impart some of their wisdom. Should be more of it! I wish the overall result this season was more favourable, regardless it's honestly been fun coaching the Tigers. Above all, I hope that the kids enjoyed the season, and continue to building their appreciation and knowledge of the game.

Last year's crop of U14s was huge, over 60 registered players just in that age bracket alone. 3 Sunday teams and 5 Friday teams just from Cheltenham. As with all things organising helpers and volunteers to fill the various roles needed took plenty of time and effort. Dave Holland was keen to expand his accountabilities from LL coordinator to U14s as well as coach a Friday team. Sunday coaches this season were going to be David Buckthorpe taking on the U14A team, and Paul Cummings looking after the U14B.
