The conversation at the end of most games went something like, "Gee we played well. I reckon we might have got up if we had one more hitter in the line-up." Our end of season result of 6 wins, 6 losses and 3 washouts is a true indication of how the year panned out for us. We were competitive in the majority of our games, the exceptions being a disappointing performance against Doncaster and an end of season loss against Geelong that has been talked about enough.

On the whole our efforts were excellent. Defensively we were very solid, with good pitching from Michael Rizzi and Yoshi Campitelli setting the tone. When we had to turn to Dan Ward-Bourton to get us out of a hole, he did the job more often than not, although the field was kept on its toes! The work behind the dish by James Upfill was consistent and he was a reliable contributor to the team week in, week out. Elliot Macquire in centre field continued to impress with his great range and strong arm, catching many oppositions off guard. Matt Carlile gave us his usual intensity and commitment that we have come to expect.

We used 31 players this season, the above-mentioned formed the core and are to be congratulated on their efforts. Using so many players creates its own problems. Our best side was capable of beating anyone. If we were a little light on it would generally show up in the hitting. We left 96 runners on base for the season.

Season highlights included a great win over eventual finalist Malvern and coming from 10 runs down against Essendon, another finalist, to tie the game. We did this with the help of the Gribben brothers. Dan soon found out that if you catch in the 3rds it doesn't mean you won't be called on to pitch. I hope the shoulder has come good!

Of our six losses this season, 3 were by 1 run. Our 3 draws were games we were in a position to win and the other 'what if?' was that of the 3 washouts. 2 were against sides we easily accounted for through the year in the corresponding games. The bottom line is that when our opportunities presented we just didn't grab them. The effort and commitment of the side got better as the year went on and on reflection the inability to create a more stable side was costly, but that is the nature of any club's thirds.

It would be remiss of me not to mention the efforts of Dan Ward-Bourton. He continues to contribute to this club at both a junior and senior level. His on-field performance this season was outstanding, hitting 500 and ending up with an era of 4.42. Well done mate.
