The Thirds and Fourths suffered most from the shortage of players and struggled each week to field sides. The fourths were made up of veterans who called in many favours to field a side. The thirds were not so fortunate and had to use two or three older players to make up the numbers in an otherwise young side. To all the players and part-timers in these teams, thank you for the special effort.

The younger junior teams are strong (both in ability and numbers) but this is not the case with the current U16 and U18 sides. With few junior players moving up to senior baseball next season the Club must recruit new senior players or our position will be worse not better next year. Hopefully the younger, but nonetheless experienced, seniors who have "taken a year off" will return next season and we will be able to attract some new players.

We will face increased financial pressure in the future as so much of the work now carried out by Council will fall on the Club to implement. However, with the best grounds in the East, I feel we are in a position of some strength and must be ready and willing to take advantage of any chance to develop further our assets.

For the year just gone, thanks to Pat and Barry and their helpers in the Canteen, Jack in the Bar, Steve and his sponsorship, Jill in the uniform shop and many others for their tireless work.

Last but by no means least, thank you to the Coaches, Team Managers, Scorers, Umpires and parents for their work throughout the year. Special mention must be made of Connie Upfill for her excellent work in running the Tee Ball this summer.

The Committee and I could not begin to cope without the help of all these people. Thank you.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Without doubt, Season 98/99 has been the most frustrating year of my three year tenure as Summer Treasurer. With the ground problems of 97/98 behind us and the Gladstone Park Bingo Centre producing regular and meaningful dividends, the Summer Committee embarked upon the Season with high expectations of generating a reasonable surplus for the year.

As it turned out, the Bingo dividend stream dried up in December as the Bingo Centre found itself embroiled in a legal dispute with its landlord. The directors of the Bingo Centre are hopeful that a resolution to the dispute can be found in the short term but have warned that it may be six months or more before further dividends are distributed to the participating clubs.

To make matters worse, the Club saw 25 or so senior players retire or take a break from baseball in 98/99 resulting in a significant loss of fee income and a reduced spending in the canteen and bar. Also, the VBA's decision the share under 12 and under 14 Friday night games between Bonbeach, Moorabbin and Cheltenham further diminished our canteen revenue for the year.

The reduction in playing stocks made it more difficult to be forceful with unfinancial players and one of the most disappointing aspects of this year's activities has been the number of players, both junior and senior, who have thus far failed to honour their financial obligations to the club. At the time of writing, there are more than 30 registered players who have yet to pay some or all of their fees. Your club urgently needs this revenue to discharge outstanding accounts and I urge those of you who are still unfinancial to settle up as quickly as possible.

On a positive note, special thanks to Pat and Barry, Connie Upfill and to Jill. Their contributions again this year starkly demonstrate that the Summer membership continues to allow too much to be done by too few.

Finally, acknowledgement to Stephen Harper and to Australian Heritage Homes whose support has been critical to balancing the books this year.
