SENIOR BASEBALL.

I trust that whole Club will be there to support them.

While the C2 team did not enjoy a successful season (managing only a handful of wins), it was good to see the new faces & their enthusiasm, & the degree of improvement that occurred in a number of old ones.

All credit for this seasons performances so far must go to Trevor Hogben. Ross Ginns, Kirk Peterson & Dirk Beven for their leadership both on the training track and on & off the field. It was particularly pleasing for me personally to see John Ferguson once again involved in Winter Baseball.

It was also great to see the dedication of the majority of Senior players at training and the extra dimension added through the late arrival of Matthew Sheldon-Collins and Pavid Buckthospe. It was disappointing however that a number of players did not continue that effort for the full season. This one area in which we need a significant improvement in 1988 if we are to remain a power in the DBA.

JUNIOR BASEBALL.

The Under 17's, under Michael Roberts, with assistance from Mark Lewis, failed to show a consistent performance despite a number of the players showing that they are capable of being good competitors in the Senior ranks next season.

Kevin Howe has already indicated that he will not be looking after the Under 13's next year. I believe his efforts will be sadly missed in the Junior ranks, and would like to thank him on behalf of all the Club for his committment over the past five years.

THE COMMITTEES.

If you were present in these rooms for the first game of the season, you should not need to be reminded of the efforts that the Social Committee, and in particular Joe Peterson, Olivia Lowrie & Dirk Beven have put in during the season. The money the Committee has raised will be put to good use in the future.

The General Committee also had a busy schedule, ranging from the pre-season search for a Coach, the defence of the A Reserve competition in the DBA, the fight for improved playing conditions and the organisation of working bees to improve ground facilities. I am glad to say that with exceptional effects from Frank Babidge, Pirk Beven & Greg Wheeler, they have proved to be most capable of the task. They proved themselves through this year of new challenges to be a most efficient and formidable line up (and capable of continuing to be so, for a number of years to come).

I would like to personally thank each & every member of both Committees for their continued excellence and their significant commitment to the present well-being and future of the Club.

CONCLUSTON.

I will not be accepting nomination for any Winter Committee position in 1988. Between work and family commitments I Will not have the time to put in the effort that I believe is required to do the job properly.

I would like to thank my wife, Sue, for her help ad support during the past 3 years. There were times when, without her support I would not have kept going.
