Olivia, Simon, Bruce and Trevor the efforts at an executive level have been terrific this season. Your support and advice has been very much appreciated. Jenny, thankyou for running the Kiosk the way a Kiosk should be run, the early mornings and late afternoons are over for awhile now and a well deserved rest on Saturday afternoons can be looked forward to.

In closing I would like to thank all club members for what I am sure will be looked on in years to come as one of, if not the most successful and enjoyable Winter Season on record.

The middle infield of Steve Babidge and Anthony Smith provided excellent defensive support to Tony and Matt Gourlay's pitching and Alex's catching. Chris Smith filled in for a few winning games while Alex was injured and Lee Stubb's also played nearly half of the season in A Grade in his first year with Cheltenham. 
