Presidents Report

This season can be looked back on as being a successful one both on the field and financially. To maintain the eight senior sides along with nine junior sides is the main reason for this success. At a junior level the club again performed extremely well with eight out of the nine sides reaching finals, four out of the eight reaching grand finals and three out of that four winning premierships. These kind of results are reflective of the efforts put in by the coaches at junior level. At our junior presentation night six players also received awards for making representative sides at various levels. Jarryd Hansford also made the All Star side that will be travelling to Mount Gambier next month.

When you look at the talent that has evolved through the years through the junior ranks the club is in a healthy position to continue to produce successful senior sides. Possibly the most pleasing factor is that around 70% of our under 16/18 players are already competing in senior baseball.

The club again prospered with our senior sides. Seven out of the eight played in finals with a premiership already being picked up from the Womens competition and the 'C' Grade playing off for a premiership this weekend. All other sides had great years but unfortunately couldn't get the necessary results through the finals series to earn the right to play off for premierships. The work of all coaches must be recognised as I think you will agree that this has been one of the coldest and wettest winters in a while. The players must also be commended for their perseverance.

Socially the club again performed well, the seventies night was huge, Dave Butler again brought in the crowds, the cricketers came through for us again with the \$1000 draw, but unfortunately the Hero night was a fizzer. Three out of four wasn't bad. On top of this we again hosted the Australia Post Day which raised valuable revenue for the club. The introduction of Polish Spirit (VERY STRONG), to the bar this season seemed to scare a few away however there were still some long Saturday nights.

Despite not applying for the Grand Finals this season the club seems to have been able to generate enough revenue to operate successfully. The building of the scorers box placed added strain on finances but I think you will agree that it is something that the club has needed for years. After being knocked around a bit in the past due to some unexplained losses the club has recovered this year to not only pay its' way but we have also paid off the loan. This relieves the club of a huge burden and we can only hope that the future brings us financial security.

President's report (cont'd)

The changes at council have placed added pressure on clubs to be viable so it is vital that club members become involved with the club at a political level. The policing of licences, grounds and the pavilion cannot be handled by a committee of six. I would strongly recommend to the in coming committee a position of club liaison officer would be an appropriate addition to the structure with the changes afoot in the current political climate.

Thankyou to Greg Brown for another dedicated year and also to Michael 'Milk Crate' Trevorah for the work he has put into the club this year with both coaching and the scorers box. Robyn Hogben took on the canteen this season and did a magnificent job and Gadget ran his bar Gadget style, thankyou to you both for your commitment to the club.

In closing I would like to wish the in coming committee all the success for next season and hope as a club that we can continue to build and prosper.

Also, thankyou to this years committee for all their efforts and hardwork throughout the season.

'A' Grade Report

Unfortunately Ben missed both finals due to an ankle operation, but he should be up and around soon to continue on some very good form.

Under 14's (2) Report

The team started the season in good form and was sharing top position with the other Cheltenham team for the early part of the season.

Unfortunately our style of play, whilst winning games, would not allow us to be competitive in the finals. Therefore the game plan was altered to encourage all players to hit the ball and not to rely on being balled-to-base. As an aside "hitting" should receive far more attention and the Club should develop some overall programme for junior players next season not leaving it entirely to individual coaches.

During this adjustment period we dropped 2 1/2 games in 3 weeks but from that point we did not lose another game for the season.

During the middle part of the season we also started to lose players due to sickness, accident, holidays etc. but were fortunate to recruit three experienced Cheltenham players. We went into one game with only four of our original ten players. In addition, had it not been for the new players, we would have had to forfeit the first of the finals having only six of the original ten players available for this game.

Having a list of 13 players all positions in the team were keenly contested. It was also pleasing to be able to provide players for the Club's under 16 team. A number of players promoted recorded safe hits and it proved to be valuable experience.

Finishing in third position at the end of the regular games we were drawn to play Dingly in the first final - the loser being eliminated. This game proved to be tight with Cheltenham leading 3 to 1 after 3 innings. The compulsory change of pitchers proved critical with Dingley failing to add to their score. Cheltenham added 3 runs (no outs) before time was called at 11:00 Cheltenham winning 6 to 1.

The Preliminary Final was played against the other Cheltenham team and like the first final this game was very tight early with the score 1 to nil in our favour after 2 innings. Our batters cut loose in the third and added 8 runs. No additional runs were scored and we ran out winners - 9 to nil.

The Grand Final was placed against Moorabbin. We opened aggressively scoring 2 runs in the 1st innings and an additional run in the 3rd to lead 3 to nil. Our batters exploded in the 4th adding 8 runs to put the game beyond doubt. Moorabbin failed to score in the bottom of the 4th and the game was won 11 to nil.

Attendance at practice was only fair with a number of the players having other sport, social or schooling commitments. However, this allowed more attention to be given to the new players and certainly there was a noticeable difference in their performance by the end of the season. Deliberately I have not mentioned any individual players as I would prefer not to individualise. As an example of the performance level, 8 players had batting averages of 400 or over.

Whilst parental support was at times disappointing, the Cheltenham turnout for the Grand Final was very satisfying and no doubt contributed to the team's performance.

In all a most satisfactory season.


