The final series proved most disappionting. After a brilliant victory over Preston the team slumped to turn in sub-standard performances against the eventual Grand finalists, Coburg and Newport.

Our final position of 3rd place was a true indication of the teams abilities, as we were defeated by the top two teams on a total of 6 occasions during the season.

The results indicate a giant step forward after a disastrous 1976/77 season, and the team was organised and led most efficiently by John Ferguson, whose total dedication and personal example provided strong leadership and achieved a re-birth of that vital ingredient - TEAM SPIRIT.

GROUN PLAYING AREA
