## **President's Report**

As far as results on the field are concerned 1978-79 Summer Season of VBA could hardly be called a successful season after finishing fourth the previous season.

#### **First Nine**

The First Nine finished 11<sup>th</sup> and were 6 games ahead of Fitzroy and only 2.5 games out of the Four. The Club scored an average of only 3.3 runs per game the lowest number in the Division 1 and clearly the loss of several top hitters from the previous season and restricted batting practice facilities impacted our offensive performance.

A number of young players were recruited to the Club and several tried in the Firsts. Of these Leigh Foster in the outfield and Robert Bell either pitching at shortstop and in the outfield, were the most impressive.

One area of impressive improvement was the team defence and the Club finished amongst the top three Clubs with the least number of runs scored against us.

#### Second Nine

The Team finished in 5<sup>th</sup> position. Alan Tanner as Team manager and Assistant to the Club Coach gave tremendous support to John Ferguson in all aspects

The Team performed credibly and many young players gained valuable experience under such an experienced and astute player as Alan and it was unfortunate that the team did not make the finals to gain the added experience that only finals can bring.

#### **Division 1 Zone**

This Team initially managed by Steve Bott got away to a good start but lost a number of close games to less talented sides. Despite an excellent string of victories towards the end of the season including giving Grand Finalists Newport a baseball lesson finished in 5<sup>th</sup> position.

From a Club viewpoint the most promising aspect of the Team's effort was the performance of three under 15 players who gradually won regular places as the season progressed. I refer to Neil LePage, Warren Kennedy and Dean Sinfield whose performances in open age competition possibly exceeded their efforts in the U15 Competition.



#### **Junior Nines**

#### Under 17

Michael Trevorah had the unenviable task of trying to mould a team out of inexperienced players and to his credit he stuck to the task to make the team competitive.

#### Under 15

Len LePage was a most dedicated coach putting in hours of work and effort with a large and talented group of boys. The earned their place in the Grand Final and against another talented Team in Moorabbin they were narrowly defeated in a game of an extremely high standard.

#### Under 13

The Team was generally undermanned with a preponderance of boys in the 8-10 years age bracket with a heavy load resting on Rob Stewart whose performances were again outstanding being rewarded with State selection.

Despite a young team the boys gave a good account of themselves and improved progressively won more games than expected often defeating older and better equipped sides on a number of occasions to finish the season in 5<sup>Th</sup> position.

# CHEITENHAM EASEBALL CLUB SUMMER SEASON 1978/79 REPORT

#### COMPETITION

The Club has concluded a disappointing summer season on the field, in terms of success. Three senior teams and three junior teams were fielded, and only one team (Under 15) reached a final series.

The senior Division 1 team performed dismally to finish second-last (11th.position) in its competition, the lowest standing for this team in the Club's history. It is now necessary for this team to be revitalised if it is to become a force in senior baseball in the future. The Division 1 Reserves and Zone teams finished in 6th. and 5th. positions respectively, and both performed creditably.

The Under 17 team was undermanned, and had a poor season. The Under 15 team was narrowly defeated in the Grand Final, and their combination of talented players and hard work produced excellent results. The Under 13 team was extremely young and inexperienced, and was not disgraced.

Overall, the junior section of the Club showed little, if any, progress from last year, and the time has come to plan and organise for a larger representation at this level.

A healthy sign was the appearance this year of a greater number of young players in the Reserves and Zone teams.

#### DIVISION 1 TEAM

A poor performance by a team from which much was expected after a successful season last year. The acquisition of recruits Rob. Bell and Leigh Foster, and the return of Rick. Parker counterbelanced the loss of Ted wale (to Upwey) and Alan Middleton (to Melbourne). The team performed reasonably well in defence, despite inconsistent pitching. Our performance in the batting box, however, was always anaemic, and often inept, and our average of 3.3 runs scored per game was the lowest in the competition.

We were frequently behind in the game scores and were forced to play "catchup" baseball on these occasions, thus limiting the manager's tactical options, and leaving no margin for defensive error. The teams performance should not be a reflection on the coaching abilities of the manager, John Ferguson.

His preparation, training and organisation of the team was an outstanding example of correct modern baseball coaching technique.
