After a good deal of pre season planning and player assessment it was extremely disappointing and disastrous from a Club viewpoint to find that for a variety of reasons 38 of last season's players were unavailable.

Consequently we had to rely heavily on our junior players with some 7 teenagers playing in the first nine in the early part of the

The pressure of playing under 17's and senior games on the same day took its toll and with injuries and illness together with general

inexperience it was difficult to win games.

There were occasional flashes of brilliance(e.g. Port Melbourne at Chelterham when Mark Dinnie pitched well and was backed up by tight fielding and excellent base running to record a good win) and against Williamstown at Footscray where the batting was exceptional with Laurie Hall, Kevin Williams and Al Baker achieving 14 hits between them supported by Curtis Sinfield with (3) hits to achieve a desperate win.

After Christmas the return of several experienced players bolstered the line up with a most timely and satisfying resultachieved against

Upwey-Ferntree Gully (eventual runners up).

A most impressive result was the last game of the season when seamingly having the game won early we surrendered the lead to Footscray in the 9th innings and came again to win with Laurie Hall fittingly hitting in the winning run to show that we have the necessary ability to feature in next seasons finals.

Players returning such as Ian Brown, Paul Feguson, Wayne Bailey Ron Boles, Alan Tanner and John Ferguson made a big difference by adding the necessary

experience to assist in building the confidence in our younger players.

As it transpired we avoided relegation by two games.

The Coaching Staff of Laurie Hall, Kevin Williams (batting), Michael Trevorah (reserves) and Pert Calvert(fitness) worked extremely hard practising the routine plays and instilling in our juniors the need to be able to perform various set plays and routines and work together as a close knit group - generally our fielding was at an acceptable level.

Batting howveer was a major problem with our inability to score suffi sufficient runs a major weakness with only one or two players batting over .300 whereas the leading clubs have five or six players achieving such results and this area of activity reqires substantial improvement.

Attendance at practice during the season varied from poor to good with pre season work at Monash University outstanding after a slow start and this aspect of team effort needs to be lifted considerably.

### SECOND NINE

Played 18 Won 5 Lost 13 Runs for 120 Runs against 132 Finished 8th on the ladder

After a reasonbly good start to the seasom the Second Nine lost a string of games primarily due to a lack of pitching strength and

Another disappointing feature of the season for the Team Coach, Michael Trevorah, was the fact that so many players failed to turn up to games after being selected and failed to notify anybody in the Club, let alone there team coach, that they were unavailable; this lack of discipline has been discussed by the Committee and in future players will be separately dealt with by the Committee.

Again many junior players received a good grounding by playing under the experienced coaching of Michael Trevorah and such players as Steve Thorburn(ex Preston), Curtis Sinfield, Steve Lawrence, Marko Tossavainen, Tony Dinnie, Robert Ainscough, David Johnson and Matthew Stewartwill be better players in 1986/87 as a result.

### THIRD NINE

### DIVISION 3

The standardin this Division was extremely high and it must be realised that our third nine is playing against (5) five Clos First Nines and with the lack of experienced players we found the going very tough.

In contrast to the previous season when the team comprised a number of experienced players 1985/86 saw the team comprised of basically junior players with one or two players who have had some experience and in general we were consistently outclassed by much stronger opposition.

To the creditof the young players they tried extremely hard and will have gained much needed experience in general and made aware of the higher standard and dedication that is neede to achieve victory.

Graeme Ainscough managed the team for the initial part of the Season with John Ferguson assuming control after Christmas following his return from overseas and it can only be said that in the early part of the season the lack of numbers made it extremely difficult to field an adequate and competitive line up against what was generally formidable opposition.

The Grand Final was an extraordinary game in which we appeared to be well beaten trailing 12 runs to 2 but fought back magnificently to go down narrowly 12 runs to 10; another indication that the game is neve over until the last picth. In fact we had the winning runners on base

at the time.

If we had had all players available all season then undoubtedly we would have been playing off for the state championship which Sandringham narrowly lost to Essendon 6 runs to 5.

- Our Bingo Sessions started in November 1985 at Moorabbin Entertainment Centre Nepean Highway Moorabbin (near Station) and are conducted each Thursday between 12 noon and 3 p.m. and have developed steadily and are proving a sound source of income which is required to service a building fund loan towards the new pavilion. This Committees Contribution is \$12,500.
- BUILD NG FUND Donations, Pledges, Loans exceed \$2000 and I would like to place on record my own appreciation and those of the Committee for those persons who have already contributed towards this fund; it is something new for us all but already has proven to be a mostworthwhile effort and will reduce the need for us to borrow; the full contribution towards the building development.

# CLUB ACTED AS LIAISON . FOR NORMERN TERRITORY UNDER 18 TEAM

Many members will be unaware that Cheltenham Club officially acted as liaison Club for this team while they were in Melbourne.

As I reside close to Waverley's ground and also close to Monash University where the team were resident I took the opportunity to become involved. Frank Dinnie and Ray Sinfield were co-opted to assist if and when required and in general we satisfacturily handled all requirements.

- \*Christmas Barbecue at the Hall's was poorly attended.
- \*Games Night at the McHarry's was reeasonably well attended but could have been a lot better .
- \*Dutch Auctionat the Stewart's (Dingley) was a great night for those who bothered to attend.

#### THE FUTURE

The future of the Club appears bright with our finances in good shape and the new pavikion possibly being a reality by the start of 1986/87 season.

However, from the playing side of the Club there is much to be done to enable us to regain Division \*.

We must retain all of our existing junior players and develop them to the best of our ability and recruit suitable key players who can lift us in the areas of pitching and catching and add a few strong batters to our line up.

Club Coach - As you are aware Laurie Hall is stepping down from the coaching position of the Club and we are in the process of trying to recruit a suitable replacement, which is not an easy task.

Club Secretary- We also are required to find a new Club Secretary following completion of Kevin Russells term of Office and this is a key appointment to ensure that the Club functions along sound lines.

SPONSORSHIP

This is a key area of development which we have already made plans to develop and matters are in hand for contact with some local businesses with a view to gaining some financial assistance towards meeting possible costs involved with our coaching appointment.

I would be remiss if I did not express my personal appreciation for the dedicated work of all committee members during the past twelve months; with so much to achieve I have been grateful for the outstanding contributions by so many individuals and I could not have carried out my functions as President without their loyal support.

Also I must thank my wife and family for their support and understanding during the past twelve months as so much of my time is taken up with Baseball at both Club level and Association level and without this support I could not continue in my post.
