COACHES REPORT 1988/89

Overall the Club had the best year on the field for 7 years. The improvement in playing performance continued at all levels and the 4 senior sides were filled with the minimum of effort. Competition for places in the teams resulted in good turn outs for practices and was a major factor in the Club's marked improvement.

The Club and I were extremely fortunate to have the services of a very experienced group of senior coaches and players to lead and assist the younger members and they certainly made my job much easier than in previous seasons. In particular my thanks to Bert Calvert, Kevin Williams, Gary Hicks and Laurie Hall for their help with the Firsts and Seconds as well as Bruce Fitzgerald, John Carlile, Mick Trevorah and Kevin Russell for their help with the Thirds and Fourths.

The Club benefited greatly from the skills and experience of our second International player - Greg Brown. Greg's pitching in both the Firsts and the Seconds provided the Club with 19 wins, 1 save and only 4 losses and clearly justified the emphasis placed by the Committee on the importance of the man in the middle.

The benefits of the batting tunnel were also very evident with much improved performances at the plate (Firsts averaged 10 hits per game) and in the format of practice. I am sure that as our young players gain their adult strength and continue to improve their work habits, most of our offensive concerns will disappear.

The emphasis on improving upper body strength must have a high priority and the excellent conditioning and flexibility programme set down by Bert Calvert this season needs to continue next season.

High priority must also be given to ensuring the Club's players participate in the coaching accreditation courses run by the VBA. These courses broaden a players knowledge of the game and introduce the important sports science and medicine component into the coaching and development of individuals. I strongly recommend that all Coaches and players on our senior list make the time available to attend these courses over the next 12 months.

Priority must also be given to more individual coaching of our elite players to ensure they achieve their full potential.

My congratulations go to Michael Trevorah and his Team on their outstanding job of winning the State Pee Wee title.

My congratulations also go to David Coppens and Brad Lark and their TEE BALL team for winning the first State Tee Ball title.

Thanks to Graeme Ainscough, Trevor Martin and their Committee for their complete support throughout the season.

The Team finished third behind Williamstown and Doncaster after giving a good account of ourselves in the finals. We lost narrowly to Williamstown in the first semi final, defeated Bonbeach comfortably in the elimination final but then lost again to Williamstown in the preliminary final.

The following comparision at the end of the home and away games clearly shows how much the team has improved over the last three seasons:

The reasons for this improvement lay in a number of areas.

Greg Brown did an excellent job on the mound pitching 116 innings (1,807 pitches and 82 strikeouts) while holding the opposition to 108 hits and giving up only 31 earned runs for an ERA of 2.4. Greg's 10:4 record included 3 losses to Williamstown in spite of a top class effort in the first semi. Congratulations go to Greg for winning the Club Champion Award.

 $\frac{\text{Dean Connor}}{29}$ provided good support with 97 innings, only 97 hits and $\frac{\text{Dean Honor}}{29}$ earned runs for an ERA of 2.6 and a 5:4 record. Dean also lead the Club in hitting with a .357 average from 33 hits.

Andy Connor had his best season with the Club winning his first Golden Glove Award by catching 196 innings with only 3 errors and 8 passballs. Andy also lead the team with 31 RBI's from 31 hits and a batting average of .355.

Gary Hicks provided the clean up power the Club has lacked for some time with 35 hits for 26 RBI's and a slugging average of .470. Gary also filled in very ably behind the mask for 61 innings (only 5 stolen bases) and also won a game as a pitcher.

Laurie Hall again turned in his usual consistent season to lead the team with hits 39 and 19 stolen bases.

Kevin Williams came back from premature retirement to play very solid first base and provide the on-field leadership needed to stabilise the infield and the top end of the batting line up.

Lee Bailey hit .442 with 23 hits from only 67 appearances and was also a major contributor even though he lost half the season due to a broken hand.

The season also saw many new faces in the side on a regular basis — Alex Porreca proved to be more than a useful utility player, Mark — Diamond played solid third base and showed a lot of aggression at the plate, Chris Reece added much needed speed to the outfield and on the base paths and Matty Stewart and Steve Lewis both showed that they are serious contenders for regular places in the side.

I am also very proud to record that the team was remarkable in its ability to fight back from behind, especially with 2 out and late in the game. This spirit and determination was in keeping with the best tradition of our Club and will be a vital ingredient in our continued push towards a place in the First Division.

My special thanks to Terese Connor our Scorer and Statistian for another top class effort.

In some instances this was achieved from two down and nobody on. This was a substantial contributor to our second place finish after the home and way season. I am sure that many other teams in the same position may not have even made the finals. Our leading hitter was Leon Harris who was consistent all year. Leon's hitting is easily first nine standard and if the defensive side of his game was tidied up would surely be a contender for first nine baseball.

As for our grand final performance we were a little unlucky to lose John Ferguson whose defensive work at third base was excellent, Matty Stewart and Johnny Stevenson. However it did give opportunity for youngster Darren Smith who played an excellent game at short stop and Marco Tossavainen who played third base, both players may otherwise not have started. In the long run this experience may prove invaluable for the future. Doncaster in the long run proved too strong winning 8-3.

A little tighter in defence in the early stages and one or two hits at the right time may well have turned the game our way seeing there was only two runs in it at the top of seven.

Congratulations to all the players on a pretty good season, it was a good season made easy by the efforts of our scorer Lisa Harris and first base coach, Bert Calvert. I would like to thank both of them for their outstanding efforts.

JUNIOR REPORT
