PRESIDENT'S REPORT

5 years ago:

- : We were going into our largest recession.

2 years ago:

- : There were 3 Victorian national league teams.

- : A Australian playing in the U.S.A. would not be part owner of a national Australian team.
- : Cheltenham never envisaged having 2 senior female teams.



Season 1995/1996:

- : We established training lights in conjunction with the winter committee.
- : We are 1 of the 3 largest clubs which we share with, Waverley and Upwey.
- A Junior policy document was formulated with assistance from our Junior leaders.
- : We fielded 8 Senior teams, 2 of which are womens.
- : We fielded 22 Junior teams.
- : We established a new Junior structure to take workload from a few individuals.
- : We established new accounts procedures.
- : We are the envy of a lot of clubs.
- : We were successful on the field.
- : We will turn over in excess of \$120,000.

In addition to this there are a number of areas which we as a club require to be addressed. These areas will be documented and passed onto the incoming committee for action.

As I stated previously we must move with the times on and off the field and looking back at the previous paragraphs this reassures us why.

Finally, I thank everybody who has contributed to our club this season, wish you the best for the following 6 months and wish Brad and the winter committee success in the following 6 months.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Whilst we started from behind with debts from previous seasons and undisclosed situations we have been able to conclude the season in what could be called a satisfactory if not ideal position.

The excellent results on the field though brought with them extra strains financially as our VBA charges for umpires escalated.

Due to increased sales in both the canteen and bar together with improved gross profit we have been able to post a good result.

Overall, whilst we have a strategy in place for external income to help subsidise our fee structure and to allow for expenditure on facilities and equipment, these are not due to bear fruit for some 12-14 months, in the meantime we must face season 1995-1996 with enthusiasm tempered with prudence, enabling us to ensure we remain the Melbourne club the other clubs wish to emulate.

EXPENSES RELATING TO FEES.

The most asked question of the committee asked each year is: "why are our fees so high." Below is a condensed version of just how much it costs each year, taken from this years Statement of Finances.

Divide this into the minimum \$46,000 it cost to run the club 170 - \$270.60 for every player.

What about juniors, are they paying too much?
