Unfortunately no home games means no income, and the club has lost many thousands of dollars due to the loss of canteen and bar revenue. Fortunately, thanks to our treasurer Jack Bourton we should still make the black.

Critical to achieving a positive financial result this year has been the revenue earned from our investment in Gladstone Park Bingo Centre. We are grateful for the vision of Graeme Ainscough in creating the opportunity for Cheltenham Baseball Club to generate funds from a source outside the Club. Without this revenue the closure of the grounds would have caused us great financial difficulties this year.

I would like to thank Lance Blackley for completing the various projects he started last year. Thankyou also to Pat and Barry in the Canteen for their tireless work especially this year with games being played all over the place. A special thanks also to Mick Manning for his expertise and advice and to all members of this year's Committee. It's been a trying year, but we got there.

The progress that Cheltenham Baseball Club has made in the last ten years has taken other clubs a lot longer to achieve. We have the best club rooms and one of the best playing surfaces in the league. But maintaining these facilities takes effort. More hands mean less work so become a committee member and join the club to make it even more successful next season.
