

The 2018-19 season for the Rustlers brought home a club championship along with Division 2 minor and major premierships for the club.



But even with 12 we were still short on numbers some weeks, so fortunately we were able to call upon past players, friends and relatives to enable us to field a full team each week. Thank you to Deb Ghulliani, Jess Jensen, Laura Spence, Narelle Gosstray, Rachel Ogilvie and Teresa Yong for their much appreciated cameo appearances.

Without doubt the Women's Team is now permanent entity in the Club line up and is set for many competitive, successful seasons to come. Not only has the Women's Team proven



that it can be successful on the diamond, even more importantly is the value of the team to the Club off the diamond, with the tireless effort of the Women proving extremely important in all fundraising, committee and social events.

Settling in quickly, we had a great mix of players and hit the ground running this season, holding our own most weeks. Our final results provided 11 wins from the 16 Rounds (with all 16 games played). These results completely reflected our finishing position with us beating every team below us on the ladder, but unfortunately none of the teams finishing above us on the ladder. 4th place meant that we were in the finals and even though the team bus was full with excitement and expectation, unfortunately our first finals game was also going to prove to be our last for the season with us going down to the eventual premiers.

Some impressive stats include:

- Every Player batted over .200, 9 Players batted over .300, 5 Players batted over .400,
 2 Players batted over .500 and 1 Player batted over .600
- The team Scored 200 Runs for the season, averaging just under 13 runs per game
- The team's Fielding Percentage for the Season was .876, meaning that 87.6% of the time we had an opportunity to get an out we did.
- We had one player who played all 16 games of the season.

Thanks to Damon Pettit for his great work as our First Base Coach; to Brad Heenan for his assistance as co-pilot in the team bus and his help on game day; to Michelle Ogilvie for keeping us coordinated; and to Russ Ashen and Ferg for helping out with training sessions.

MASTERS REPORT (THE OLDER WE GET - THE BETTER WE WERE!)

Played 16 Won 11 Lost 5 Drew 1 Winning Percentage 71.9%

A Top Four finish for the fourth successive year before losing to a stronger and much younger Bonbeach Red in the Semi Final.



The team consistently produced entertaining baseball based around outstanding starting pitching and intelligent offence.

PITCHING

The "Big Train" Lance Blackley (7 W) and "Big Dog" Russ Ashen (3.5 W) started most of the games and generally out smarted the opposition batters with their command of location and a broad assortment of junk that kept the opposition batters off balance. Both were assisted by a strong and versatile outfield defence, Lefty Gomez, the great Yankee pitcher when asked "What is your greatest asset as a pitcher, Lefty replied "Fast outfielders" This was certainly true this season.



Rookie Southpaw, Joe Caruso was brought up from our farm system for a critical game late in the season to pitch 2 shutout innings to keep the team's bid for a place in the finals alive.

Gus Marr picked up an important late season win and Darren Hiddleston and continued to provide effective short relief.

DEFENCE

Center fielder Adam, Tony Kouchadkjian and the Dunkley brothers Heath and Brent ran down everything hit their way. Heath again showed on several occasions that he has the best arm in the competition as he cut down several overly optimistic base runners with throws seldom seen at Masters level.

Behind the plate youngster Damon Pettit was very solid and the "Energiser Bunny" David Johnson filled in whenever and where ever necessary.

The loss of Joey "Super Glue" Tucker at short stop mid -season to a severe leg injury could have destabilized the infield. Joey's crucial outs and regular double plays were missed however outfielder Heath Dunkley was pressed into service to fill the critical short stop position and Heath did more than an adequate job until relieved by Gus Marr late in the season.

Former junior players with the Club, Rookies Steve and Peter Flaski returned and settled in quickly to hold down first base and both provided timely extra base hits in clutch situations. "Mr Utility", Rod Hind had another good year at the plate and he provided great defense both in the infield and outfield. Rod also displayed hidden talent in a surprise and effective appearance on the mound.

OFFENCE

The team's major strength continued to be it's batting and our hitters consistently pressured the opposition pitchers by waiting to get a good pitch to hit.

Of the regulars with over 20 At Bats; eight players over BA.300.. Joey Tucker BA.347 (8 Hits), Darren Hiddelstone BA.343 (16 hits), Adam Leech BA .477 (21 Hits), David Johnson BA . 3654 (11 Hits) Russell Ashen BA .364 (12hits) Tony Kouchakdjian BA.424 (4 Hits) Rod Hind BA.323 (11 Hits) Peter Flaski BA . 467 (14 Hits).

Gus Marr BA .267 (4 Hits) and Lance Blackley BA. 555 (6 Hits) Brent Dunkley BA .230 (6 Hits) Damon Pettit BA .280 (7 Hits) also made timely contributions at the plate.
